- There is a storm drain on Port property that is located near the bike path at the base of Magnolia Hill. The bike path will likely need to be closed for 1 or 2 days. Rosie will keep the neighbors informed as she learns more.
- Don provided a report about diseased trees in Queen Anne caused by climate change. He suggests that Magnolia research their trees. The parks department is working to determine replacement trees.
